Accreditation

Please be aware that all media representatives have to present a negative Covid-19 test when picking up their accreditation. This must not be older than 48 hours for foreigners and must not be older than 24 hours for German citizens. Without a valid test, you will not receive your accreditation. You must also complete the 'health declaration form' which was sent to you with your accreditation confirmation email.

Parking

If you arrive by car please use car park P1. You will receive an exit ticket at the accreditation point.

Courtside positions for photographers — There is only a limited amount of photo positions available courtside. These positions will be allocated at the photo briefing which is mandatory to attend. Positions are allocated individually for each match. Priority for courtside positions will go to photographers from those teams competing and to major agencies.

Virtual media operations

Media calls, mixed zone and post-match press conferences will be conducted via MS Teams. There is no face-to-face contact possible between media and the players. All accredited media representatives have been added to the EHF FINAL4 2021 Team on MS Teams. Make sure you have the MS Teams app installed on your mobile phone/tablet or that you are logged into MS Teams via on your computer. 

I EHF FINAL4 MEN LINEUP CONFIRMED

The quarter-finals of the EHF Champions League Men concluded last month with three of the four ties going right down to the wire.

- Aalborg booked their debut EHF FINAL4 with a narrow aggregate win vs Flensburg
- PSG overthrew the defending champions THW Kiel to clinch their berth
- Nantes held on in the second leg to beat Veszprém by two on aggregate
- · Barça cruised to two victories over HC Meshkov Brest



I DEBUTANTS, PAST IVINNERS AND THREE SPANISH COACHES

FACTS AND FIGURES: ALL THE NUMBERS YOU NEED TO KNOW BEFORE THE FHE FINAL 4 MEN.

After 112 group matches, 14 play-offs and eight quarter-finals, the four participants of the EHF FINAL4 are confirmed: Debutants Aalborg, record winners Barcelona, and two French sides — both past finalists — Nantes and PSG are in the pots for the semi-final draw on Tuesday in Cologne.

Here are the main facts and figures:

- O clubs defended their trophy in Cologne since the implementation of the EHF FINAL4 in 2010. Kiel share this fate after the aggregate defeat against PSG
- quarter-final matches needed to be assessed by the EHF due to COVID-19 reasons

team will make a debut at the EHF FINAL4:
Aalborg Håndbold

- 1 player has defended the trophy in Cologne so far since 2010 — Ivan Cupic. After winning the 2016 title with Kielce, the Croatian became VELUX EHF Champions League winner in 2017 with Vardar. In 2019, he took his third trophy
- 1 male has won the trophy in Cologne as a player and a coach: Filip Jicha — 2010 and 2012 on the court and 2020 on the bench; all for THW Kiel
- 1 team turned a defeat in the first-leg quarterfinal into the ticket to Cologne: PSG. Aalborg and Nantes lost the second-leg matches, but qualified
- 1 goal was the closest aggregate gap in the quarter-finals, when Aalborg eliminated Flensburg 55:54. In the play-offs against Porto, Aalborg were equal on goals, but proceeded thanks to the away goal rule
- 1 team won both quarter-finals: Barcelona

(against Meshkov Brest)

- 1 previous EHF Champions League winner is still in the race for the trophy: Barcelona (1996–2000, 2005, 2011, 2015). Kiel (2007, 2010, 2012, 2020) and Flensburg (2014) were eliminated in the quarter-finals; Vardar (2017, 2019), Celje (2004) and Kielce (2016) in the play-offs
- 2 head coaches of the four EHF FINAL4 participants have won the EHF Champions League as coaches: Xavi Pascual (Barcelona/two) and Raul Gonzalez (PSG/one). Alberto Entrerrios (Nantes) has won the Champions League three times as a player with Ciudad Real. Stefan Madsen (Aalborg) has never reached this stage of the EHF Champions League
- 2 for the second time, after 2018, more than one French team qualified for the EHF FINAL4. Three years ago it was winners Montpellier, finalists Nantes and third-ranked team PSG. Now, Nantes and Paris are back
- 2 of the four EHF FINAL4 2021 participants were part of the last EHF FINAL4 in December 2020 Barcelona were runners-up and Paris finished third after the sides duelled in the semi-final (37:32 in favour of Barcelona)
- 3 of the four EHF FINAL4 participants have been part of at least one EHF FINAL4 (inaugurated in 2010): Barcelona (now nine participations and two trophies), Paris (now four participations and zero trophies) and Nantes (now two participations and zero trophies). The only exceptions are debutants Aalborg.

Spanish head coaches are still part of the competition — Xavi Pascual (Barcelona), Alberto Entrerrios (Nantes) and Raul Gonzalez (PSG) — and at least one of them will make it to the final.

- 3 males have won the EHF Champions League as players and coaches: Talant Dujshebaev (player for Santander; coach of Ciudad Real and Kielce), Roberto Parrondo (player of Ciudad Real; coach of HC Vardar) and Filip Jicha (player and later coach of THW Kiel). Alberto Entrerrios could become number four
- 5 different nations are represented by the 12 previous winners of the EHF FINAL4: Germany (Kiel in 2010, 2012 and 2020; Hamburg in 2013; Flensburg in 2014), Spain (Barcelona in 2011 and 2015), Poland (Kielce in 2016), North Macedonia (Vardar in 2017 and 2019) and France (Montpellier in 2018). Two of those nations (Spain and France) are still represented in the race for the 2021 trophy

times in nine home matches this season, Barcelona scored 40 or more goals

- 9 for the ninth time since 2010, the defending champions did not qualify for the EHF FINAL4
- 10 group matches and zero play-offs or quarterfinals — ended with 70 and more goals scored
- 12 matches seven of 112 group matches, four of 14 play-offs and one of eight quarter-finals ended with a difference of 10 or more goals
- 14 previous Champions League winners are in the squads of the four participants: seven for Barcelona, four for Paris, three for Nantes and zero for Aalborg
- 15 different clubs had been part of the 11 EHF FINAL 4 events. The 16th club is Aalborg, the Danish debutants in 2021
- 16 points in 18 matches seven victories, two draws and nine defeats were enough for Nantes to qualify for the EHF FINAL4
- 17 times, including the 2020/21 season,
 Barcelona have qualified for the semi-finals in the
 EHF Champions League. Next among the 2021
 semi-finalists are Paris (five), Nantes (two) and
 debutants Aalborg (one)
- 19 goals in a single match was the lowest score of

- a team so far this season: first, when Szeged lost the group match 19:25 at Porto, then Elverum's 19:39 loss in Barcelona in the play-offs. Flensburg scored 21 goals in the away quarter-final in Aalborg
- 20 goals was the biggest difference in one match this season, when Barcelona won the second play-off leg 39:19 against Elverum. The biggest gap in the quarter-finals was 12 goals, when Barcelona beat Brest 40:28.
- 27 group matches in a row have been won by Barcelona since the opening defeat in Szeged in the 2019/20 season. In total, Barcelona won 32 of the last 33 Champions League matches the only defeat was the 2019/20 final against Kiel in Cologne in December 2020.
- 28 points the maximum, earned by Barcelona in 2020/21 represents a new record since the group phase has been played with eight teams per group
- **40** goals in a single quarter-final was the high score, when Barcelona beat Brest 40:28. The overall high score of the season was 45 goals, when Barcelona beat Zagreb 45:27 in the group phase
- 44 goals scored in the match Porto vs Szeged (25:19) was the lowest score since the start of the group phase. The low score in the quarter-finals was the 47 goals in the match Aalborg vs Flensburg (26:21)
- 45 Champions League home matches in a row have seen Barça unbeaten, including 27 straight victories
- 150 the match on 13 June, which will be either the final or the placement match in Cologne, will be PSG's 150th EHF CL match overall
- 483 goals were scored in the eight quarter-final matches decided on court an average of 60.3
- 654 goals scored by Barcelona for them to have by far the most efficient attack so far an average of 36.3 goals in 18 matches
- 7,420 goals had been scored in those 123 matches, decided on court, including 6,102 in the group phase and 835 in the play-offs

Paris Saint-Germain Handball and Aalborg Håndbold are set to throw off the most anticipated weekend in men's club handball when they meet in the first semi-final of the EHF FINAL4 2021 in Cologne on Saturday. While PSG are among the title favourites each season and are entering their fifth EHF FINAL4 event, Aalborg are newcomers to the marquee event as they attempt to crown their standout season.

- PSG play their fifth EHF FINAL4 event, Aalborg their first
- PSG reached (and lost) the final once, in 2017, while Aalborg have not gone beyond the Last 16 in previous seasons
- PSG finished third of group A before eliminating Celje in the play-offs and titleholders THW Kiel in the quarter-final
- Aalborg ranked fourth in group B and went on to beat Porto in the play-offs and Flensburg in the quarter-final
- Mikkel Hansen leads for PSG with 80 goals and Nikolaj Christensen is Aalborg's best scorer with 61 goals
- Hansen will join Aalborg in the summer of 2022
- Aalborg's Henrik Møllgaard played for PSG in 2015-18
- the teams have met four times in the EHF Champions League, with PSG winning each time and scoring more than 30 goals
- both teams won their domestic league this season: PSG won the French title for the eighth time, Aalborg became Danish champions for the third straight time





Barça start their next attempt to win another EHF Champions League title against HBC Nantes in the second semi-final at the EHF FINAL4 on Saturday, less than six months after the Spanish side came up short in the final of the 2020 edition. Nantes are more than dangerous outsiders, having been to the final in 2018 and coming off a strong campaign that saw them beat the likes of Kiel, Kielce and Veszprém.

- Barça arrive in Cologne for the EHF FINAL4 for the ninth time, while Nantes take part for the second time after reaching the final in 2018
- Barça have won the Champions League a record eight times, Nantes are seeking their first European trophy
- winning all their 18 matches so far this season, Barça set a record coming into the EHF FINAL4
- Barça finished first in group B and easily defeated Elverum and Meshkov Brest in the knockout rounds
- Nantes ranked fifth in the same group before getting impressive wins over Kielce in the play-offs and Veszprém in the quarter-final
- only one goal separates both team's best scorer: Nantes' Valero Rivera has scored 86 times, Barça's Dika Mem 85
- Barça have already collected two trophies this season: the Spanish league and cup; Nantes have finished the French league in third place
- Nantes' players Valero Rivera, Adria Figueras, Kiril Lazarov, David Balaguer and Eduardo Gurbindo all played for Barça in recent years
- this weekend Raul Entrerrios, Cédric Sorhaindo, Kevin Møller and Jure Dolenec play their last game for Barça, while coach Xavi Pascual will also leave in the off-season

I IMPORTANT REGULATIONS

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN TWO OR MORE TEAMS HAVE THE SAME NUMBER OF POINTS

30 minutes with a half-time break of 15 mins.

If a Semi-final match or the Final (place 1/2) ends in a draw, there will be a five minutes break followed by one extra time of 2 x 5 minutes, there will be a one minute half-time break at half-time for the changeover of teams.

If the placement match 3/4 ends in a draw, there shall be no extra time, the match will be decided directly by penalty throws.

If penalty throws are needed to decide the match, the procedure is as follows:

- Prior to the penalty throws, each team shall name five players eligible to play at the end of the match by handing the referees a list of numbers. These players shall then take one throw each, alternating with their opponents. Each team is free to determine the sequence in which throwers will take their throws
- The goalkeepers may be freely selected from the match report and exchanged in accordance with the Rules of the Game. Goalkeepers may take throws and throwers may perform as goalkeepers.
- At the Technical Meeting the teams will be informed at which goal the penalty throws will be taken. The team taking the first penalty throw shall be determined by the referees by drawing lots. The team winning the draw may choose whether it wishes to throw first or last.
- If the scores are equal after the first round of penalty throws, it shall be continued until a decision is reached. In the second round, the other team shall start. Again five players shall be named who are eligible to play (the players named before may be named once again).

- All matches of the EHF FINAL4 Men shall be played in 2 x In the second round, a decision is reached when a goal difference arises after both teams have taken one throw each
 - Eligible players are players entered in the match report that have not been disqualified or suspended at the time of the final whistle.
 - Serious infractions committed during penalty throws shall be sanctioned by disqualification. If a thrower is disqualified or suffers an injury, an eligible substitute player shall be supplementary named.
 - While the throws are being taken, only the player taking the throw, the current goalkeeper and the referees may enter the respective half of the playing court.
 - If the number of eligible players falls below five. players may be named to take a second throw in the same round

I PSG DUO AIM FOR THE FOURTH TROPHY

None of the current EHF Champions League players who will be on court at the EHF FINAL4 in Cologne have more than three titles in their account. The top-ranked players in this context is a PSG duo - defence specialist Viran Morros and playmaker Nikola Karabatic, who will be both aiming for the fourth trophy. Six players at the EHF FINAL4 2020/21 are multiple winners with at least two trophies — five from Barça, plus Morros — alongside two coaches, Nantes' Alberto Entrerrios (three trophies as a player for Ciudad Real) and Barça's Xavi Pascual (two trophies as coach of Barça). In total, 14 players on court set to be on court in Cologne have won the EHF Champions League at least once, plus PSG coach Raul Gonzalez (2017 as coach of Vardar). Andrei Xepkin is still the most successful player in history, with seven trophies (six with Barcelona; one with Kiel), followed by three of his former Barcelona teammates who won the title six times with the Spanish powerhouse. Two more players count six trophies won with more than one club.

I NEW DESIGN FOR THE WINNERS' TROPHY

The new ultimate prize for Europe's elite handball clubs has been revealed on the fringes of the start of 2020/21 season. One design has emerged from 27 submissions across 12 European nations to become the new EHF Champions League trophy.

With a new era of European handball on the horizon, EHF Marketing launched a public tender with the goal of finding the best possible new trophy design for the EHF Champions League. During this process, a total of 27 designs were received from companies and artists in 12 countries, making it a truly European competition. The new trophies have been created in accordance with the new brand guidelines. The winning agency was <u>Sustain Awards</u> by <u>Oiko Design Office</u>, a Spanish agency based in Barcelona, specialising in the design and production of environmentally responsible trophies.

The core idea of the trophy was to represent a goal as the main objective of the sport, to reflect the dynamic movement of a ball hitting the target and to transmit handball as a team sport by forming the net in the shape of a shield. The net itself symbolises the needed connection within a team - all for one and one for all.

For the first time, the design is the same for both men's and women's competitions and every element from the font to the logo fits the new competition identity. The materials of which the trophies consist of are aluminium cast (30% recycled aluminium) for the body and base, and recycled balls used for the sculptural ball which hits the net. A golden bath covers the trophies, making sure they are in line with the new brand image, giving them the premium touch that all trophies need. The sustainability of the materials has been a key element in the choice of the winning design. The trophies are each 80 cm high, 57 cm wide and weigh 10 kg.



I EHF FINAL4 COUNTS DOWN TO ITS 2021 EDITION

The EHF FINAL4 is the culmination of the European handball season. The two-day event sees the best four men's teams in Europe playing to decide the ultimate winner of the EHF Champions League Men. Throughout the current season, this tournament will see even two editions played as the 2020 tournament took place on 28/29 December 2020 due to the Covid-19 outbreak and the revamped competition in 2020/21 with a new format reaches its peak now on 12/13 June 2021.

Introduced in the 2009/10 season and to be played until at least 2024 in the LANXESS arena, Cologne, the decision to create a new format for

the final phase of the EHF Champions League was seen as crucial for the growth of handball across Europe. The aim was to create a flagship event, one that could compete on the international sports market and make the Europe's leading club competition even more attractive to fans, partners and sponsors.

The success of all previous editions of the EHF FINAL4 up to date showed that this format has been the right strategy. It has set new standards in organisation and entertainment; it is not just four games played over two days but a true entertainment event.

- 5 goals is the biggest winning margin in an EHF FINAL4 final, and this feat has been achieved three times so far: Kiel beat Madrid 26:21 in the 2012 final, Barcelona defeated Veszprém 28:23 in 2015, and Montpellier downed Nantes 32:27 in 2018.
- 5 different nations are represented by the 11 champions since the introduction of the EHF FINAL4 in 2010: France (1 Montpellier 2018), Germany (5 Kiel 2010, 2012, 2020; Hamburg 2013; Flensburg 2014), North Macedonia (2 Vardar 2017, 2019), Poland (1 Kielce 2016), and Spain (2 Barcelona 2011, 2015).
- 5 different German clubs have qualified for EHF FINAL4 events: Kiel, Hamburg, Rhein-Neckar Löwen, Flensburg and Berlin, and three of them won the title: Kiel, Hamburg and Flensburg.

- 7 different clubs won the trophy in Cologne: Kiel three times (2010, 2012, 2020), while Barcelona (2011, 2015) and Vardar (2017, 2019) twice. Hamburg (2013), Flensburg (2014), Kielce (2016) and Montpellier (2018) are all one-time winners of the EHF FINAL4.
- 9 times Aron Palmarsson has been part of the EHF FINAL4, more than any other player: Palmarsson played at the LANXESS arena in Cologne with Kiel (including the golden years 2010 and 2012), Veszprém and Barcelona.

- 12 times, a player has scored 10 or more goals in a single EHF FINAL4 match. One player has achieved the feat twice at the same event: PSG's Mikkel Hansen in 2016. Kiel's Filip Jicha also reached double digits on two ocassions: in the final of 2010 and in the semi-final of 2012.
- 13 goals in a single EHF FINAL4 match is still the record, set by Barcelona's Juanin Garcia at the inaugural tournament in 2010.
